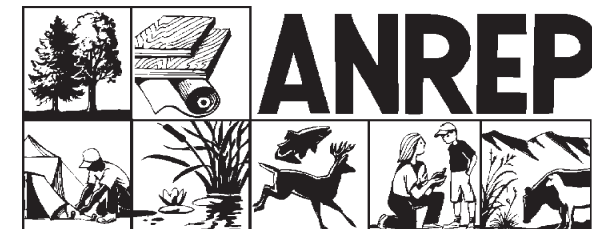

## Natural Resource Extension

Natural resources are vital to our economy and quality of life. Education is often touted as the key to effective, sustainable natural resource management. Doing that requires a variety of creative approaches to educating landowners, managers, decision makers, and youth.

## Who should join ANREP?

ANREP is a national association for Cooperative Extension Service professionals working in environmental education, fisheries, forestry, wood sciences, range, recreation, waste management, water, watersheds, coastal resources, Sea Grant, climate change, wildlife, sustainable living, energy, and related disciplines.
